9.1. Delegate Issues and Concerns

9.1.1) Code of Student Conduct review

• Carrera.55: One of the things that the Council of Student Affairs oversees is the Student Code of Conduct. The Code of Student Conduct was reviewed 2 years ago and I was the chair of the committee that reviewed it. This year, we're doing a smaller, targeted update to the Code as it relates to disruption. I wanted to tell everyone that there is work that students are doing outside of just talking. Particularly, we're looking at what happens when a student violates the Code and is being charged in a criminal case. The updates will be finalized this semester and be sent to the administration for approval. Whether or not they are found in violation, if a student who breaks the Code of Conduct and is charged in a criminal case goes through with restorative justice, it's viewed positively by OSU and a judge. The results of the case can't actually be admissible in court, regardless of the outcome, however if they write a written statement that they violated the Code, then this can be admissible in court. Our update is removing the statement of violation so that a student can request to resolve the code violation without self-incrimination in a criminal court. We realized this was a mistake given last year's events, so happy to take questions about that.

9.1.2) FOD concerns

- Levesque.31: FOD has come into biology labs to wax floors and this has blocked access to labs. People can't go into labs that need attention, their cleaning schedule has not been accurate and they just come in and don't check with people. We're more than willing to schedule experiments around it, but we need to know when they'll be in there to do so.
- **Durso.19**: FOD sucks and is horrible at communicating. This has not fallen on deaf ears, I will again talk to them. If anyone's research gets destroyed by FOD: FOD should use their budget to fix these things.
- **Levesque.31:** Biological Sciences building is the worst made building on campus, there's been fires and flooding, so it's insult to injury that they will come in and act like we're the problem for blocking them to wax the floors.
- Rocha.1: Haven't been able to put this issue on graduate caucus, because there wasn't time. During the Senate Fiscal committee, there was a University Government committee on how to change spaces. They're wanting to create a new app called campus market space, and marketing it as Zillow where you can see what spaces are being used and how many people are there. Just wanted to throw that out there.
- Durso.19: That's good to know, thank you for conceptualizing that.

9.1.3) Adobe Suite and other programs access removed

- Rogers.1843: I'm from the Visual Media department, and wanted to bring up the issue again of
 Adobe Suite being removed. This is affecting a lot of my constituents because we use this for
 publications and things like that. Lots of other programs in it would be useful. I know you're aware,
 so I was wondering how we can bring this to a broader graduate student audience. Maybe a survey
 could be created?
- Durso.19: I have heard it, and just like with the Overleaf issue, I'm sending it in a survey the
 Delegate Digest. Make sure you share Delegate Digest with departments so we can get survey
 results for these issues. I'm also interested in asking Dean Stromberger to put this out in the
 graduate school newsletter. We're looking at ways to advocate for programs or colleges who need
 this. It won't be on this Delegate Digest because I didn't get it in time, but as soon as we send out
 another one, a survey about Adobe suite will be on there.
- **Arshad.32:** Asked my advisor for his opinion on Overleaf issue as well and he agrees with what you're saying. He said departments could possibly pay for it and maybe that would help.
- **Durso.19**: I have asked departments before and they rejected this because of lack of funds. That's why I asked Bill to try and get the colleges to pay for this, but I hear you
- Fritz.288: I would be interested to know why they've excluded these software recently. My understanding is that Adobe is not being used anymore because of an access concern and security



- risks. If Overleaf has recently changed their position on policy and maybe that's why we're not using it.
- Durso.19: OTDI is running campus wide accessibility checks. These programs have to be
 accessible for it to be University-wide. Going to colleges and programs is acceptable because they
 do pay for these things on their own but if we're going the University route, it will need to be
 accessible.

9.1.4) Delayed funding requests for student orgs

- Sarkar.115: Political science department is having trouble getting reimbursed. A grad student organization in the department asked the university to pay for something and they didn't hear anything until after the event was done. This organization was accidentally categorized as a spring org and they couldn't access funds afterwards. The system isn't working well.
- Durso.19: Send me the name of the specific grad student org and I can make sure it gets to the Council of Student Affairs who oversees funding for programs like this.
- Rocha.1: Was this a program funding request, sorry I didn't hear that?
- Sarkar.115: I'm assuming so since it was a grad student organization.
- **Rocha.1**: If it's a program funding request, Peter right here is the chair of the allegation requests. There's usually request number along with a funding request. If it's a funding request through CSA, you can send us that number and we can take a look at it.
- Durso.19: You can e-mail Carerra.55 since he is the chair of CSA. He has to make sure your issue
 gets taken care of a little better, so I would just e-mail Peter and say hey what are you going to do
 about this.
- Fritz.288: Where does your student organization usually get your funding from? Is it from the department?
- Sarkar.115: Well, it's usually assigned from the regular student funding.
- Fritz.288: Ok cool, thank you.

9.1.5) Procedures and safety concerns for campus shootings

- Arslanozkaynak.1: So, if you remember about the shootings that happened on campus recently, I and some of my colleagues were in a classroom on campus and one of the doors could not be locked. Our professor asked Ted Carter personally about how the doors could be locked or what's being done about that. She referred to the protests earlier this summer and how they had a system where they had some solutions to target students. But then, when it comes to shootings and everything even classes cannot be locked which was a big problem. So, they said that they were going to look into it, and then there will be some inspections in our building. But I wonder, how many other buildings have the same problem. And as an international student, I had never been in that sort of situation, so I was clueless. But the other domestic students knew what to do when something like that happens. So, I wonder if these things could be added into trainings that target students?
- Durso.19: They're in the middle of hiring a new chief of the OSU police, but they're not going to hire them until next week because it's easier to have the Director of Public Safety as Chief of the OSUPD when they assume things are going to happen on campus. That all being said, email me and CGS can talk with this new chief of OSUPD and the Director of Public Safety, Monica Moll. I sit on the Public Area Safety Commission as well and will make sure these concerns are heard as loud as possible because that is terrifying. As a domestic student, I didn't realize international students aren't trained on that, so I'll make sure that's heard.
- **Teafatiller.1**: I found that the warnings for the shootings recently have come way too late. I had just gotten out of class on the day of the last shooting, and I get the text message alerting me to it after I've walked through the active shooting zone. Can they be a little faster and more on top of it?
- Durso.19: This is something that has been brought up before. When we went to the OSU police
 chief interviews, this was brought up as an issue and OSUPD is aware that their communication
 system sucks. Their problem is they don't understand how to tell when the situation is happening
 and what details to tell the public so they don't incite fear. They're being pushed by Student Life for
 them to figure it out before the new OSUPD chief takes over. It's been highly discussed.
- Teafatiller.1: Is there a platform to see live alerts?
- Durso.19: It's the same system as the Buckeye Alerts and that's also on their website.
- **Connor.280**: On OSUPD's website, they have Buckeye alerts. CGS is part of reason for why they're slower to respond now. During AY 2021 there was an incident and the statement shared just said "black male suspect heading west on 12th". This was unacceptable and a safety issue.



They're slower, because they don't want to cause more problems at times. Buckeye Alerts is the biggest one to use.

Durso.19: Everyone who was interviewed wants to fix this problem.

9.1.6) Accessible parking lot being blocked by renovations

- *Elton.21*: Campbell hall renovations are blocking an accessibility parking lot. One of my continents now only has the option to go to the Neil Garage. What can be done about that?
- Durso.19: I'll send this to the ADA office and send me the student's name.# so they know what this
 specific student needs. To have to park in Neil would not be ideal. I'll work on that to see if the
 entire parking lot can get back opened but send me the student's name.# so I can help on an
 individual basis.
- Arshad.32: On what to do for when these types of things happen, I remember there was a Buckeye Learn mandatory training for this. It's not recurring as I haven't had to take it again, but I remember it being a good one, so maybe we can ask for it to be recurring and required?
- Durso.19: Was this on your Buckeye Learn?
- Arshad.32: Yeah.
- **Durso.19**: Ok, I had that training too for when I was a first year student. I will look into that but it might be best to make it an optional training instead of a required training for every single person. Keeping that as a recurring and optional training would be good, so good idea Murtaza.

9.1.7) Accessibility buttons on doors on campus buildings

- **Teafatiller.1**: One thing about safety stuff, I'm not from Ohio and it's super windy here. There's no button for accessibility on one of the sides of Hagerty Hall, so I was just wondering, for other people's accessibility and safety, if this was something that could be fixed.
- **Durso.19**: Federal law mandates OSU only has 1 door button on a building. The building isn't required to have them if they're older than 1990. If you need me to advocate for this, send me an email and I can bring it to the ADA office.

9.1.8) Lack of tech available for students' needs

- **Tojelker.4**: Constituents complain that our department does not provide computers. Most people use personal laptops. Some students thought they would get computers when coming to OSU, so what do other departments provide? We talked earlier about technology loans, but this is different as you need a dedicated machine for research and learning all the time. How do other departments handle this for grad students?
- *Elton.21*: Public health has a shared space for desktops, so we don't all have our own monitor but we all have our own personal devices. If we have an additional device it's because of our GRA that laptops are assigned. So, if a person works at Wexner or a different school, they're assigned a laptop but it's a case-by-case basis.
- Durso.19: It's this idea that some departments have bigger budgets for technology loans than
 others. If this is happening on a departmental level, then send me an e-mail and we can work
 together to get funds allocated to your department for tech. This is an issue across campus now
 that the tech loan program doesn't have any more tech to loan out. I think it's best to figure this out
 department-ly, so we'll try to get that figured out.
- **Smith.15196**: Our tech person in Earth and Geosciences will loan tech sometimes. There's a huge concern that there's no place for TAs to have tech to teach their classes.
- Carerra.55: The Committee on Academic Technology and University Research Committee on Zoom is looking into this issue. People using personal devices for university things will have data concerns.

Over the Past Month:

- Parliamentarian: WE <u>STILL</u> NEED ONE BADLY! It's a low time commitment, as you
 largely ensure CGS is following their bylaws and lead voting sessions. Send me an
 email if interested!
- **Steering:** Senate has asked CGS to look into removing the 988 Suicide Hotline from the mental health syllabus requirement and replacing it with the TeleTherapy service. I ask Health, Wellness and Safety to take this on to gather student feedback on the use of this number.
- **Grad Council:** Fellowships are a mess; You can now request an advisor that lacks p-status; We continue to work on Graduate Student Leave Policies this year, amongst other things. If you have any ideas/concerns about leave, let me know!
- Events I attended on CGS's Behalf: National Association of Graduate and Professional Students Monthly Meeting, Grad & Prof Schools Recruitment Program

Working On:

- **CGS Newsletters:** Just waiting for the ADA's office to approve. Ugh.
- Advisor Abuse: Worked on at least five student concerns this month. Working
 alongside CGS's Academic Affairs to make a list of advisor/student expectations per
 college alongside the grad school. Additionally continuing to workshop the
 Accommodations Resolution with stakeholders---planning to have that out to you all in
 the next delegate packet.

Updates from Past Delegate Issues and Concerns:

- **Campbell Hall:** Asked ADA Coordinator to look into lack of parking due to construction. They are completing a survey to address this issue.
- Biological Sciences Building: Contacted FOD and they have promised to communicate with the concerned parties in situations where students cannot access parts of this building.
- Space Standards/Freedom of Expression Concerns: Awaiting a response from Student Life, who are contacting the Grad School and OAA for help.
- Buckeye Mail Extensions: Waiting on Dean Danny Glassman to get back to me.
- **Public Safety Concerns:** If there is an active aggressor situation, Buckeye Alert will send a Run/Hide/Fight message (OSUPD is aware Buckeye Alert is not a perfect system). If there is a less dangerous situation that is still considered a threat (like the events of 9/18/2024), you'll receive a "shelter in place" message. Additionally, when there is a potential active aggressor situation, Public Safety does not use the term

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"lockdown" on a large, open campus like OSU. OSU does not focus on locking entrance and exit doors to buildings across campus (one reason is so other campus community members can get inside during an emergency). Instead, OSU encourages people to secure themselves inside interior rooms inside buildings when they believe the "Hide" option is their best option based on their proximity to the location of the emergency. If an interior door lock is broken, we can bring it to Public Safety and/or FOD. Please share this webpage How to Respond to an Active Aggressor Situation and Video Classroom Locks with your constituents.

• Buckeye Alert: These notifications are not typically used for incidents occurring off-campus. Both are used primarily for incidents that occur on or immediately adjacent to university property when there is a risk to people on campus. Buckeye Alerts are used for things that would pose an immediate threat to the health and safety of people on campus, like a tornado or an active shooter. Public Safety Notice emails would be sent for certain crimes that could pose a serious or ongoing threat, like an on-campus armed robbery where the suspect has not been identified or apprehended. I'll continue to track any updates to this system now that there is a new Chief of OSUPD.

It's been a busy month with Hayes starting to ramp up and some internal update happenings (among other things not noteworthy enough for the formal report).

Internal Operations Updates

Sabrina and I have worked on Bylaw updates to close some gaps (formalizing executive session procedures, formalizing some of the work/collaboration between some officers and chairs, tweaking some officer job duties, changing some election procedures). Fiscal Committee – Gabriel Guzman Camacho (guzmancamacho.1) No update

Graduate Comp & Benefits – Brian Rocha.51 (rocha.51)

We are in the process of reorganizing and creating new sets of bylaws and procedures. We discussed goals, and began the process of gathering and reviewing data on proposed compensation increases, and possible changes to leave policy.

Diversity Committee – Deb Pathak.89 (pathak.89)No update

Council on Student Affairs – Krutant Mehta (mehta.337)

The Council on Student Affairs has begun inviting different university departments and organizations to present to and attend full council meetings. Work on the 2024 Student Activity Fee Redistribution has started; beneficiaries have begun submitting materials. CSA completed redistributing 2023-2024 carryforwad to beneficiaries for the 2024-2025 year. CSA also finalized an update to the Code of Student Conduct relating to disruption.

Intellectual & Property, Patents, and Copyright Committee—Brian Rocha (rocha.51) Solidify committee structure; created working groups to address by-laws revision and other action items.

Council of Academic Affairs – Andrew Miles (miles.375)

The committee made official the revisions to the following programs: Master in Supply Chain Management, Human Nutrition programs, and the MA in Education Studies—Counselor Education Specialization program. Discussions were held to adjust the clinical faculty cap in the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences. This was tabled for the next meeting with the idea that they will request a waiver for being over the cap, followed by a request to expand that number. Additionally, the review process for the Center for Health Outcomes and Policy Evaluation Studies (HOPES) was approved. We have also got regular updates about the Chase Center; the timeline for CAA to review the proposal is planned as of now for December; this is a unique proposal as the center will have the 1.) ability to offer curriculum and 2). the center will be a tenure initiating unit, both of which are not norms for a center.

Council of Academic Freedom & Responsibility – Jorge E. Clavo Abbass (clavoabbass.1) Has not met in October.



Rules Committee – Jorge E. Clavo Abbass (clavoabbass.1)

Met on 10/18 and 10/25. Ongoing discussions include Code of Student Conduct revisions and updates to the University Rules to be consistent with these revisions, modification to the Rules language on who sits on the Council of Deans, and updating the Rules on Dean's List for undergraduates.

Library Committee – Gabriel Guzman Camacho (guzmancamacho.1)No update

University Research Committee – Tony Annerino (annerino.2) / Andrew Miles (miles.375) URC met on October 4th, and the bulk of discussion focused on the state of university open access publishing agreements. OSU has multi-year open access publishing agreements with several academic journal publishers, most notably Elsevier, Springer, and Wiley, that cover the open access publishing fee for the first several accepted open access articles accepted by journals that these publishers operate, regardless of field, and the allotment of such articles is set to go up every year over the course of these agreements. At the time of this meeting, the Elsevier allotment had already been used up for this year, and the Springer and Wiley allotments were on track to be used up by the end of 2024, which is what needs to happen to convince the university to justify expanding and extending these agreements in the future.

Committee on Academic Technology – Tony Annerino (annerino.2)

CAT did not meet in October because it was decided after the first Monday of October that the recurring CAT meetings would occur on the first Monday of the month. The first full CAT meeting of this academic year is scheduled for November 4th. The first major agenda item for that meeting is introducing and assigning members to the subcommittees on (1) Ohio State Online and (2) Technology Tools for Academics and Research. The second agenda item is an update on ODTI initiatives from interim chief information officer Ginger Breon.

This report summarizes the discussions and action items from the Housing and Family Affairs (HAFA) Committee meeting held on October 8, 2024.

Discussion Points & Action Items

- a. We discussed creating a protocol for online showings, focusing on international students and those unable to attend in-person viewings.

- b. **Action Item:** Work with OCCSE to include documentation requirements for all listings to help students avoid pursuing unsuitable properties.
- 4. Video Uploads of Housing Units on OCCSE Portal
- a. OCCSE is requesting property owners to upload videos of available units.
- b. Action Items:
- i. Ensure the videos reflect actual housing units, not model apartments.
- ii. Recommend that videos be updated within the past six months for relevance.
- 5. Orientation for International Students
- a. We are considering developing an orientation session tailored for international students in collaboration with OIA, ISA, and OCCSE.
- b. **Action Item:** Structure the orientation similarly to the "Off-Campus Living 1.0" session, with a focus on topics like legal rights, lease signing, and housing searches.
- i. Resource: Off-Campus Living 1.0
- 6. Event to Promote Housing Resources
- a. We are exploring the idea of hosting an event to promote various housing resources for graduate students.

To raise awareness about the "little things" people can do to be more sustainable, we will be sharing sustainability tips each month that we plan to share in the delegate digest.



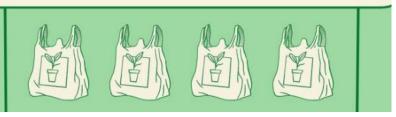
NOVEMBER SUSTAINABILITY TIP:
