Meeting Minutes for Approval

- 1.1. Dr. Melissa Shivers, Senior Vice President of Student Life
 - 1.1.1) Importance of graduate student delegates to graduate student life
 - 1.1.2) There's been a 300% increase of students for disability services over the last decade.
 - Needs increase in staff and support for disability services, wants a stand-alone student life disability services building
 - 1.1.4) New student resource center coming to campus: Monda Student Resource Center
 - It will be a one-stop shop for campus resources: food pantry and clothing closet will be housed there.
 - Student emergency funds will be housed there.
 - Someone from Franklin County social services will have office hours in the building to assist students and families with community resources.
 - 1.1.5) Political activity increase on campus until November elections
 - Student Life has been looking over University Space standards during the summertime to make sure there are opportunities for students' voices to be heard.

1.1.6) Q + A:

- Q: Unknown CGSer: Hi, for this one-stop student resource center can you talk about where on campus it will be and what hours will be available for services?
 A: Dr. Shivers: The Younkin Student Success Center is where the new student resources center will be available. There will be alternating hours, including days where it's open later in the afternoon to accommodate students.
- Q: Booker.200: So last academic year, CGS had released a statement that said we stand in solidarity with many other faculty, staff and students and urge all relevant units of OSU to immediately work for the dismissal, expungement, and reversal of all charges and disciplinary actions brought against all students, staff and community members arrested between April 23rd and April 25th 2024 regarding the protests on campus. I'm wondering if there's been any change in how the University has dealt with the situation or any expungement of the charges brought against students.
 - A: *Dr. Shivers:* I can't tell you about any individual student case, but I can tell you we haven't moved towards any expungement. Once students are arrested, we don't get any opportunity to say that the student shouldn't be arrested. And we're still in the same space
- Q: Arshad.32: So the new initiative, will it be able to help any students? I've heard a couple scenarios of international graduate students who were on fellowship and their fellowships weren't getting renewed. There are a couple departments who don't have the funds to get these fellowships renewed. I'm from the engineering department, so I have privilege, but in other departments they don't care anymore, right? Will this initiative help them or is there something we can do?
 - A: **Dr. Shivers:** Office of Student Advocacy will be located in that space, so they will be able to provide support and point students in the right direction. We have 60 graduate students who work in the Office of Student Life and I imagine we'll employ many graduate students to work in the Monda Student Life Center. I don't know if the jobs would be as lucrative as the fellowships, but certainly we hope this addresses some of the financial challenges and pitfalls we're facing.
- Q: *Unknown CGSer*: I'm from the political science department and I know a lot of my colleagues, especially international students, have trouble getting housing and finding affordable housing in particular. Is this center going to help with that at all?
 - A: *Dr. Shivers*: I've got 2 answers to that question. There is the Office of Campus and Commuter Engagement and then we could introduce her now? *Durso.19*: Yeah, sure.
 - **Dr. Shivers:** We do have a brand new position in the office of campus and commuter and students engagement. Her name is Jennifer Davis. She's sitting in the back row, and she



is designated to help graduate students find housing within all of Columbus and help their needs, whether they're incoming or not. This position came because of advocacy that started in this room. I would also say in the student resource center. Again, if we're having conversations with students about food insecurity, about housing and security, we'll be able to create and connect those dots to make sure that if students find their way to us that we also find a way to get them connected off campus and community engagement.

- Q: *Unknown CGSer*: I have 2 kids and I know others who have kids and grandkids as well. My question is there any support for health? Like funding for support to help my kids because I have a balance I'm not able to afford. Is there any form of support we can get? *A: Dr. Shivers:* How about you and I connect offline and we can talk more?
- Q: Unknown CGSer: We need a place in our building to just relax and sometimes a room for nursing. Would that center be able to help us with that?
 - A: **Dr. Shivers:** I know that in different buildings there are spaces that have been designated, and I imagine that within the Monda Student Resource Center, the staff there will have a better idea of where those locations are, and that we will have one of those within the Monda resource center within the Younkin Success Center. But I think it will also be important to have awareness of where they are located across campus. Did that answer your question?

Unknown CGSer: Yeah, just like a space to relax, not even just for modest purposes. Maybe a nursing room for mothers or just a quiet space to go and relax.

Unknown CGSer: If you google 'lactaction rooms OSU' it should pop up with a map. **Dr. Shivers:** Yes and I think she's talking about other just quiet rooms on campus. I don't have a full list but that's definitely something we need to bring awareness of.

- Q: Unknown CGSer: Super happy to have Jennifer on board. Could you discuss more
 exactly what is being done to help graduate students and their search for affordable
 housing. Is there anything by University being done, or Is Jennifer just stepping in and
 taking over everything completely herself?
- A: **Dr. Shivers:** A big part of Jennifer's role will be to find affordable housing for graduate students because she works in the office of student life and that's a great first step for us. If you're asking a different layered question?

Unknown CGSer: Yeah so is anything else happening besides just Jennifer? **Dr. Shivers:** She just started so yes, but she's not the only person on campus that can help with identifying affordable housing. If we're getting to the next layered questions about increases in stipends and those kinds of things, those conversations continue with our new president, Ted Carter.

Unknown CGSer: As well as options for childcare and those kinds of things? **Dr. Shivers:** I think at the last University Senate meeting, the conversations of childcare were robust and Ted Carter said he wanted to commission a group to look at what are the childcare needs and what are the things we can do to address this.

Durso.19: And that group just convened over the summer so I can update you on those things as soon as Dr. Shivers leaves.

 Q: Pathak.89: With this new position and wanting to increase support for graduate students in general. Are there any concrete plans to put out a regular annual survey of graduate students to regularly assess their needs. For example, an online survey where all grad students can share what works, any major obstacles they're having towards completing their degree? (from Zoom)

Connor.280: I'm guessing this is more geared towards grad students and their needs and less academics.

A: **Dr. Shivers:** I know that there's the student life survey that goes out, for both undergrad and grad students. That data is used and leveraged to help assess grad students needs each year.



- Q: **Connor.280**: Another zoom question one topic that has come up in many departments is ensuring positive student advisor relationships in terms of grad student well-being and mental health. What types of programs or activities does the office of student life have to ensure that faculty are part of the conversation, making it a 2 way conversation across the university?
 - A: **Dr. Shivers:** I know Counseling and Consultation Services works a lot with faculty but I'm not sure how or if they facilitate conversations between students and faculty. I'll need to get back to you on that.
- Q: Unknown CGSer: I may have missed this but when does the center open?
 A: Dr. Shivers: It will open in the Spring.
- Q: *Unknown CGSer*: About the results of the survey, I'm assuming they're public and free for anyone to look at them?
 - A: **Dr. Shivers:** Yeah actually, we can send you a link to the results of the last 10 years of the survey.
- Q: Connor.280: I've got a zoom question. I've seen firsthand how graduate students with
 medical needs need to go on leave and then lose all forms of financial support. Are there
 any forms of support for students that need to go on medical leave, especially because
 most PhD students live paycheck to paycheck.
 - A: **Dr. Shivers:** I don't think there is. I think that's a topic that we need to explore more. Dean Stromberger is looking into it.

9.1. Delegate Issues and Concerns

- 9.1.1) *Elton.21:* Ran out of food for the first time at the Graduate Welcome Banquet
 - **Durso.19:** They underestimated the number of graduate students. Numbers for food were based off of Faculty Welcome Banquet and will do better next year.

9.1.2) Tech Loan Program

- **Booker.200:** With regard to the OTDI Tech Loan program now excludes international students from the tech loan. We haven't had any communication about this. How do we find a temporary solution and how do we get the University to respond?
- Durso.19: This issue was brought up to me a couple times. I did not realize that you needed
 to fill out a FAFSA to get a tech loan (which international students can not file). I reached out
 to the Chief Information Officer of Research. CGS will try to work to fill that gap if no
 response by Tuesday.
- Annerino.200: Let me know about this because I'm on the Senate committee for academic technology
- Carrerra.55: Committee for Academic Technology doesn't have a chair for that yet.
- Annerino.200: We're working on it.
- Cerrerra.55: During that meeting today, this issue was brought up and the faculty have been made aware.



9.1.3) Accidental academic suspension on Buckeyelink

- *Elton.21:* I was placed on satisfactory academic progress suspension this past summer. I added another degree and it crashed my app. Adding the degree placed me on financial aid suspension. I fixed it, but it took a lot of effort. I had to talk to people multiple times and they said it was a sequencing issue so I just wanted to bring that to people's attention.
- Durso.19: And when you say they?
- Elton.21: Buckeye link
- **Durso.19**: Send me an e-mail with more details so I can make sure this isn't happening anywhere else.

9.1.4) Limits on Overleaf program

- Pathak.89: I'm a delegate from the astronomy department. Overleaf has been increasing prices and limiting the number of collaborators on each document. Huge issue because most of STEM students use this for writing papers. Free version is not good, putting limits on pages, figures and tables and collaborators. One that allows for increase on collaborators costs \$400 a year and is outrageous.
- Arshad.32: Seconding everything Deb mentioned. Heading towards a solution, if advisor
 has premium, then advisor can create a document and add you as a collaborator. Hack:
 have advisor get a premium membership and share the document with you
- Durso.19: I will try and look into how we can get the university to look into this. There's
 already licensing changes. They're already moving away from Zoom and want to go to
 Teams next year. Only Microsoft Teams next year.
- Lebek.31: Next academic year or calendar year?
- Durso.19: Calendar

9.1.5) Summer funding for International Students on Fellowships

- **Shahzad.17**: For summer, you have to find a job to supplement money. If you're on fellowship, you can't apply for a job.
- **Durso.19**: Dean Stromberger is working on this. Specifically for international students, we're trying to find a way to get people paid for the summer.
- **Shahzad.17**: Is there a way for us to have on-campus jobs in the summer? I tried to get a nice job, but I had to decline because of our fellowship. What can we do to remedy this?
- Durso.19: We can continue to advocate to GCBC. They want us to save from the past 9
 months to be okay for the summer. E-mail me and we can set up a meeting with Dean
 Stromberger.
- **Ledger.21**: I became a delegate to advocate for perennial international students. In the interim for Dean Stromberger, can we pass any resources to international students now?
