4.1. President's Report – Sabrina Durso.19

#### 4.1.1) Over the past month:

# 5.5.1) Committee Description:

The University Senate is the shared governing body of The Ohio State University.
 Comprised of 141 faculty, students, staff, and administrators, the Senate's primary responsibility is to advice campus leaders on the key educational and academic policy



concerns. Senate committees, their members, and their annual reports are available here: senate.osu.edu.

- The Senate is made up of:
  - 71 faculty ~50%
  - 41 students 29%
  - 17 administrators 17%
  - 5 staff ~4%
- CGS's Senate body, the Graduate Caucus, is excited to serve in the shared governance space of the university. CGS has 10 senators total. Current senators are listed here: <a href="mailto:cgs.osu.edu/about-us/executive-committee">cgs.osu.edu/about-us/executive-committee</a>.
- 5.5.2) CGS currently has 1 unfilled Senate position, it will be filled in the Fall.
- 5.6. Grad Compensation and Benefits Bryan PerezSoto.2

#### 5.6.1) Committee Description:

- GCBC is a standing committee of the University Senate and operates pursuant to section 3335-5-48.18 of the Faculty Rules and is governed by the provisions of rule 3335-5-46 of the Administrative Code.
  - 1. Study the adequacy and other attributes of the university's policies and provisions including stipends, outside professional services, and supplemental compensation.
  - 2. Conduct research and provide advice on economic support of graduate associates, professional development, quality and design of benefit programs, and appointment terms.
  - 3. Make recommendations to the university senate, the graduate council, the graduate school, and the office of academic affairs as appropriate.

#### 5.6.2) Committee Recommendations:

- Recommendation One: Graduate Associate Compensation
  - Action Item: To correspond to the cost of living in central Ohio, GCBC recommends the minimum stipend of a .5 FTE for 9 months should be no less than \$32,850.00 and no less than \$43,800.00 for a .5 FTE for 12 months, or \$3,650.00 per Month.
- Recommendation Two: Year-Round Funding Model for PhD Students
  - Action Item (External): The committee recommends a task force be established at the Graduate School to explore a transition to 12 -month funding for PhD students at Ohio State.
  - Action Item (Internal): GCBC should continue to gather case studies from comparable intuitions above and beyond what is cited in this report and work with Dean Stromberger on developing the task force.
- Recommendation Three: Evaluate University Subsidized Graduate and Family Housing
  - Action Item (External): The committee recommends that the Graduate School urge the Board of Trustees to evaluate the current rental rates of the existing graduate student housing (which is done yearly) and freeze any increase on rents until graduate stipends are at a level commensurate with cost of living in Columbus. The committee also recommends that the Graduate School coordinate with Planning, Architecture and Real Estate to explore possibilities for family housing utilizing existing campus property and resources or coordinate with private, off campus vendors to offer affordable options for family housing.
  - Action Item (Internal): GCBC can work to benchmark family housing offerings at BIG10 institutions and open lines of communication between relevant stakeholders to start exploring solutions to this issue.

# **Officer Reports**

Hello CGSers,

I hope you are all doing your best to stay cool and hydrated during this already incredibly hot summer! Pay attention to our social media accounts (CGSOSU on Instagram, X, and Bluesky) for tips on how to beat the heat in Columbus and beyond this summer. Also, please remember that Anna and I, as well as the rest of the Executive Committee, are here for you over the summer. We are looking forward to seeing all of you in September and will do our best to advocate for graduate students throughout July and August without the wisdom you all provide.

# Over the Past Month:

#### Exec:

We welcomed Jon Fritz back as Grad Caucus chair! YAY! Beyond that, everyone is working hard on planning events for the upcoming academic year! I look forward to seeing what committees you each pick to serve on.

## Graduate School:

- Retention Rates: While there are no official numbers as of yet, the Grad School is expecting that we are at least at a 5% retention loss coming into the 2025-26 academic year. They are expecting this number to increase when the numbers do come in. It does sound like we'll be able to keep international grad students who are already enrolled at OSU, but the Grad School is having difficulties getting some new international students visas. Stand Up for Science Ohio State is actively tracking many of these issues.
- o <u>Grad Compensation and Benefits:</u> Dean Stromberger shared the GCBC report with the Provost. He would like to increase the minimum stipend by 8% for the next two years, meaning that, by the end of those years, the minimum stipend will have risen 29% over five years. Dean Stromberger is also in talks with the Deans about moving to 12-month stipends, though this would most likely result in smaller or combined PhD cohorts.
- <u>Bridge Funding:</u> Dean Stromberger is still looking at how she can use unspent fellowships and gifts to the grad school to support students who have had their funding pulled. She's hoping this fund will amount to \$1.5 million worth of bridge funding. She is waiting on the Provost to approve of this. ERIK is also looking into their own bridge funding as well, and it is important to note that Peter Mohler, the Director for ERIK, has left OSU.

### • Student Life:



- Yet again, President Carter cannot meet with CGS at one of our monthly meetings, but Dr. Shivers, SVP of Student Life will come to our first meeting of the academic year. I will be sending out a similar invitation to the Provost and Dean Stromberger shortly.
- A Major Win: I've finally successfully advocated for President Carter and Provost Bellamkonda to meet with Student Government Presidents and Vice Presidents once a semester to discuss our concerns. WE ARE BACK IN THE ROOM!
- Senate Bill 1: As you will see in the Gov Affairs report, Senate Bill 1 is sticking around. CGS has been allowed to provide feedback on the new syllabus wording (yet to be approved) and has participated in many conversations about how SB1 will affect student organizations. Thus far, SB1 should not interfere with CGS's work. However, now that SB1 is implemented there is new language pertaining to its implementation, including how land acknowledgements are no longer allowed on behalf of the university, units, colleges, or departments whatsoever, including at university-sponsored events. The university has also expanded what is considered a "controversial belief or policy" to include issues such as climate policies, electoral politics, foreign policy, diversity, equity, and inclusion programs, immigration policy, marriage, and abortion, all to comply with SB1. If you have any concerns, please let me know.
  - It is important to note that <u>the University deactivated OSU's official</u>
     <u>LGBTQ+ website a week before Pride Month began to comply with</u>
     SB1.
- The Buckeye Commons: We are moving right along with hiring a director for The Buckeye Commons! We have finished phone interviews and will have in-person interviews in July.

# **Working On:**
