I hope you are all doing well and taking care of yourselves this summer. Whether you are taking the summer off, completing coursework, in the field, presenting at conferences, prepping for candidacy (like me), or working on that Dissertation, please know <u>CGS is always here for you!</u> Anna and I work throughout the summer to ensure graduate students continue to be taken care of at all levels of the university, while the rest of the executive committee is preparing for the upcoming academic year.

## **Over the Past Month:**

- Exec: Exec has been busy this month! After a quite few chairs stepped down (Thank You Sohan Daniels, Nick Booker, Priya Jana, Madeline Carrola, Peter Carrera, Chiranth Koratagere Nagaraj, Brittany Multer Hopkins, and Brian Rocha for your wonderful service to CGS), I have been onboarding new chairs to fill their BIG shoes! I've also made sure to meet with every committee chair so they feel prepared for the upcoming year.
  - Welcome Tinu Oduloye.1 (Graduate Student Affairs), Ashutosh Soni.117
     (International Student Affairs), and Katie Conner.280 (Membership Wellness) to the Exec Committee!
  - Additionally, Exec has <u>welcomed the Graduate Compensation and</u>
     <u>Benefits Chair to our team</u>. My hope is that Bryan Perez Soto.2 can help ensure CGS is update on their efforts throughout the year.
  - o I will be taking on a <u>Chief of Staff to help me out this upcoming academic year: Welcome Blue Lerner.111! Please make sure to CC Blue on all emails to me or the CGS inbox.</u>

# • Graduate School:

- Dean Stromberger and the Enterprise for Research Innovation and Knowledge (ERIK) are looking at creating bridge funding for those who are having grants pulled by utilizing unspent fellowships and development funds.
- The Offie of International Affairs and Office of Institutional Research and Planning came to update the Grad School on the International Graduate Student Experience. Ohio State hosts 2,656 international graduate students, comprising 23% of the total graduate student population. The report found that international students were less likely to seek treatment for mental health concerns. Additionally, more than 48% of international students expressed concerns about affording housing, and nearly 20% reported being unable to pay housing fees on time. One-third of respondents worried about running out of food before their next paycheck. Lastly, roughly 1 in 5 students from China reported experiencing unwelcoming behaviors, more than the average for other nationalities. Over 60% of international students who experienced



hostile or offensive behaviors reported increased concerns about their personal safety, 59% indicated a negative impact on their mental health, and 41% stated that their relationships with U.S. peers were affected. OIA is hoping to enhance mental health support, address financial concerns (year round funding), create an inclusive campus environment, and improve academic and career support (GTA training, global perspective in GLOS, and provide better resources).

- Student Life: Anna and I were onboarded alongside the incoming President and Vice President for the Inter-Professional Council (IPC). The Undergraduate Student Government (USG) still does not have an elected President and Vice President for the upcoming academic year; last year's Vice President, Justin Robinson, is standing in as the current President.
- Sunrise Conversations: HUGE SUCCESS WITH NEARLY 45 ATTENDEES! Invited faculty spoke on their experiences with student-centered teaching and urged GTAs to remember that they can go to their faculty and/or advisors any time they have concerns with teaching. We are here to learn how to support students—we are not expected to be experts. I look forward to hosting similar events in the Fall. IF YOU HAVE A PROFESSOR WHO IS WONDERFUL AT SUPPORTING STUDENTS, PLEASE LET ME KNOW!

#### Working On:

- Delegate Issues:
  - Working with Graduate Ecology & Evolution Students (GEES) and Nursing PhDs to increase their programs' minimum stipend. GEES offers more than minimum to stay competitive, while Nursing had a HUGE (nearly 1/3 of their income) increase in program fees and hope to receive an increase to cover these fees.
  - o Some departments are taking issues with anything from outside of their department being sharing on their Listservs. CGS is looking at ways to mitigate these issues and will bring a solution to Delegate Orientation. If this is happening in your department, please contact me!
- Adam and I have been looking at ways to spend the Global Gateway and Engaged Scholar Funds that have sat unspent on the CGS Budget for years. Currently, we are attempting to use the nearly \$5K from Global Gateway to host a Welcome Event alongside the Office of International Affairs. And we'd like to split the remaining roughly \$15K from Engaged Scholar between CDG and Ray, as the fund was once used to help students present their research. Adam is working with the Business Office to understand the feasibility of these options.

I have a few updates for you all about the new CGS budget for FY2026 and the Ray Travel Award.

# **CGS FY2026 Budget**

• The finalized budget act for FY2026 will be presented during the June general body meeting for approval by a CGS vote. It is attached to the Delegate Packet email. The new budget will take effect on July 1st as we roll into the new fiscal year. After hearing comments and feedback during the exec meeting, May delegate meeting, and the budget listening session, the finalized budget act for FY2026 is largely unchanged besides minor updates to the expected budgetary carry forward for SAF (Student Activity Fee) and the Coke Endowment funding sources.

# **Ray Travel Award**

- On May 22nd, results of the Ray Travel Award Funding Period 1 for FY2026 were sent to award applicants. During this funding period, 20 winners were selected from the 49 completed applications. This number of recipients was selected based on the overall historic competitive 30% acceptance rate, and accounts for the expected 70% of winners accepting their awards.
- I would like to send out my thanks and appreciation to the many judges who volunteered to score applications for this funding period. Thank you for your service!

CDG results for the first cycle of the year went out on May 16th. We had 13/24 applicants accepted for funding this period with a 54% acceptance rate! Following Jon and Adam's procedures to make Ray more equitable, I calculated the average acceptance rate over the last 5 years (which was 57%) and applied that to our first period. I rounded down to 54% since this is our first period and wanted to make a conservative estimate to ensure funding for the rest of the year. I will continue to update you on this process as we look forward to the rest of CDG cycles this year. I will include a graph of these numbers in my presentation at the next Delegate Meeting. Thank you to everyone who judged this cycle!

RE: Graduate Compensation and Benefits Chair's Report

Happy summer and Pride season!

The Graduate Compensation and Benefits Committee (GCBC) worked on wrapping up the work from 2024-2025 and submitting a final report to the University Senate. Bellow I attach a summary of the report recommendations:

- Recommendation One: Graduate Associate Compensation
  - Action Item: To correspond to the cost of living in central Ohio, GCBC recommends the minimum stipend of a .5 FTE for 9 months should be no less than \$32,850.00 and no less than \$43,800.00 for a .5 FTE for 12 months, or \$3,650.00 per Month.
- Recommendation Two: Year-Round Funding Model for PhD Students
  - o Action Item (External): The committee recommends a task force be established at the Graduate School to explore a transition to 12-month funding for PhD students at Ohio State.
  - o Action Item (Internal): GCBC should continue to gather case studies from comparable intuitions above and beyond what is cited in this report and work with Dean Stromberger on developing the task force.
- Recommendation Three: Evaluate University Subsidized Graduate and Family Housing
  - O Action Item (External): The committee recommends that the Graduate School urge the Board of Trustees to evaluate the current rental rates of the existing graduate student housing (which is done yearly) and freeze any increase on rents until graduate stipends are at a level commensurate with cost of living in Columbus. The committee also recommends that the Graduate School coordinate with Planning, Architecture and Real Estate to explore possibilities for family housing utilizing existing campus property and resources or coordinate with private, off campus vendors to offer affordable options for family housing.
  - Action Item (Internal): GCBC can work to benchmark family housing offerings at BIG10 institutions and open lines of communication between relevant stakeholders to start exploring solutions to this issue.

I am very happy about the opportunity to bring updates throughout the year on what the committee is working on!
