Email to Buckeye Village Residents:

As you may know, two Buckeye Village residents and the President of the Council of Graduate Students (CGS) met with university leaders last week to provide additional information about the unique needs of students who live on campus with their families. After considering all of the issues raised by Buckeye Village representatives and CGS President Josh Coy, the university has decided to change the originally proposed plans for addressing parking costs for Buckeye Village residents. For the coming and subsequent years:

Buckeye Village Parking Process, effective August 2014

- A new parking permit will be available for use only in the Buckeye Village residential parking lots and will not include parking access in any other university parking lot or garage.
- The parking permit will be priced at an annual fee of \$150 for the 2014-15 academic year. In future years, this fee will be subject to the annual rate

increase as stipulated in the university's agreement with CampusParc; that is not to exceed 5.5% in 2015-16.

- The parking permit will only be available for purchase by Buckeye Village residents. Consistent with the university's current parking policy, A, B and CPN parking permits will continue to be eligible to park in Buckeye Village residential parking lots, except during the approximately 40 major events that occur at the university. The university will determine a process for allowing only Buckeye Village residents to park in the residential parking lots during these major events.

- One parking permit at the rate of \$150 will be available for purchase to each residential contract holder. Residents confirmed by Buckeye Village staff as needing additional permits will have the opportunity to purchase a B or CPN permit, depending on their eligibility. The cost will be the published cost for those permits on the CampusParc website. Also consistent with the university's current parking policy, residents who demonstrate a need, and are eligible, to purchase a B or CPN permit (rather than the Buckeye Village permit), will be able to use this permit to park in Buckeye Village. A process will be determined to identify these residents to assure they can park in the Buckeye Village residential parking lots at all times.

As previously discussed, Buckeye Village monthly residential rates for the 2014-15 academic contract will be:

- o Two-bedroom: \$655 per month
- o One-bedroom: \$515 per month

The 2015-16 monthly rates will be raised by a maximum of \$10 per month. The contract deadline is Friday, April 4.

Thank you for the continued respectful and informative dialogue as we have reviewed the university's approach to parking at Buckeye Village. As I hope is apparent, this resolution recognizes both the reality of increased costs for activities and the special needs reflected in our commitment to Buckeye Village.
